THE SEASON OF PENTECOST/ADVENT

FROM THE CHOIR LOFT



For over 2,000 years, music has been an integral part of worship, both liturgy and hymns. Hymns were introduced as a means of involving the congregation in worship, thus, most of the hymnody of a particular denomination finds its roots in the country of origin – the Lutheran Church has a rich history of Scandinavian and German music, while the Episcopal Church has a rich history in English music. As I select the music for our worship, I keep in mind the scripture readings, as well as the focus of the day, but I try to also be aware of the origin of a particular hymn. The Hymnal 1982 is rich in English hymnody – there are 33 hymns by Ralph Vaughan Williams alone, a great composer recognized in both the sacred and secular musical worlds.

The hymnal committee also chose to represent early English composers, such as Henry Purcell (1659-1695) who is buried in the Composers Corner of Westminster Abbey. Recognizing the fact that the membership of the Episcopal Church represents a larger body than just those from England, in 1993, the church published Lift Every Voice and Sing II, containing music representing spirituals, gospel songs, adapted Protestant hymns, missionary and evangelistic hymns, as well as service music in both traditional and Gospel settings.

When you pick up the hymnal to sing, look for the connection to the scripture readings. Also, check out the writer of the hymn (words), as well as the composer of the hymn tune. You will be pleasantly surprised to see the connection to the day, as well as the world-wide representation of writers and composers that are helping you sing praises to God.

Bake Sale and 50/50 Raffle Saturday, November 21st - 10am to 4pm. Pre-orders will be taken until Sunday, November 8

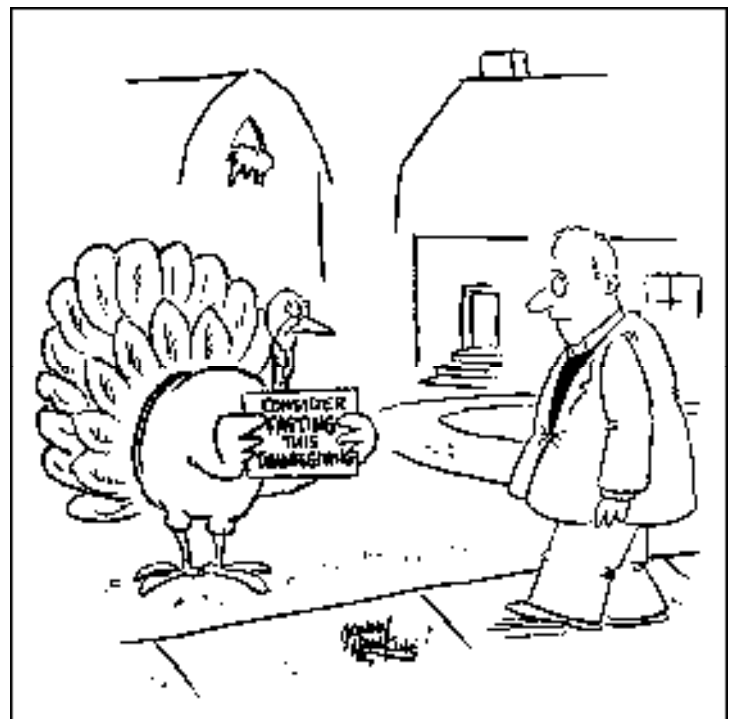
Sweet Potato pie - \$7, Pecan pie - \$10
